Note:

Previous attributions of this work, which include Eugéne Delacroix, Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec and Louis Anquetin respectively, remain uncertain.

The inscription "Coll. W-P. 42" on verso might refer to a previous owner whose identity could not be established yet.

The personal papers found in Cornelius Gurlitt's Salzburg home include a collection of about 2,400 photographs of artworks. Photograph no. 9.1_F933 is a reproduction of this work; inscribed on verso, a statement of authenticity by the art expert André Schoeller of Paris, 13, Rue de Téhéran, dated 26 February 1942. This document shows that the work was on the market in the 1940s in occupied France; there is a high probability that Gurlitt acquired the work during that period.
